A note from David Fairbairn

"Hiram, what is a 'COWAN'?" Old Scotch for mason without the word; unskilled laborer in wall building and stone work; one who builds walls without mortar. In Freemasonry an uninstructed Mason; an initiate who has not yet learned his work. No longer a term of reproach, while eavesdropper, meaning one who tries to hear Masonic work or unlawfully gain entrance to a lodge at work is such a term. Cowan appears in print and writing as early as 1598. It appears in organized Grand Lodge Masonry in print in the 1730's. Universally used in English-speaking Grand Lodges as the name of one who cannot be admitted to a lodge.
